Choir offers voice of hope

A SIMPLE tune could be the key to helping the less fortunate residents in Geelong, according to an Australian singer.

Soprano Tania de Jong AM, founder of the Geelong Sings choir, is looking to double the number of singers involved in the group in the next 12 months.

The choir has already collected 30 members, who come together to sing, as well as chat, network and develop new communication with an eclectic group of people on a weekly basis.

Geelong student Kym Dillon, who studies at the Victorian College of Arts, was chosen to conduct the choir.

The group will sing a range of music styles including African gospel, Australian songs and some well known favourites including Amazing Grace and You'll Never Walk Alone.

The group plans to perform at the Pako Festival and entertain patients at the Geelong Hospital.
