A MESSAGE FROM OUR FOUNDER & CHAIR



Friends, please join me in celebrating the fact that we got through another very challenging year for Creativity Australia's With One Voice program... we still managed to share songs and stories of hope, courage, connection, celebration of diversity and community spirit in spite of many obstacles. A huge congratulations to our team for inspiring our conductors, volunteers and members to keep singing through the storm and pivoting our choirs online in such a short time. As our choirs are meeting again in person, we all continue to be moved and inspired by the life-changing transformations, unexpected friendships, granted wishes and generosity we see at weekly choir programs across our network. We assisted many people to find work, develop new skills and form lifelong friendships. I call it the weekly miracle!

We are living in such rapidly changing times and need to support those being left behind through disruption, depression, disconnection, loneliness and social isolation.

Pre-Covid one in five Australian adults were suffering from a chronic mental health condition, one in eight Australians (and one in four older adults) were taking antidepressants, and suicide rates were rising. These figures have been significantly exacerbated by the pandemic. We need to turn these statistics around and find innovative solutions to create healthier, happier and more inclusive communities.

At Creativity Australia, we use the neuro-scientific benefits of singing as a tool for social change, wellbeing, skills development, diversity and inclusion. Our innovative model is ground-breaking, as it brings the fortunate and the marginalised together as ONE community to reduce inequality. Our programs build bridges and create a sense of 'WE' rather than 'us versus them', and gives many people a voice and sense of belonging. Whether our voices are silenced by cultural differences, age, disability, disadvantage, or just a stressful job... we all need an outlet to connect to ourselves and each other and singing together is a super wonder-drug!

Our aim is to use the simple tool of community singing combined with the sharing of supper and our innovative Wish List program to help people find their unique, creative voice and build connected, supportive communities that help solve entrenched social problems through caring for one another, rather than relying on top-down, siloed social welfare.

WISH LIST

Through the <u>Wish List</u>, participants grant one another wishes big and small: such as free music lessons, language and computer tuition, assistance with resumes, mentors and jobs. The choirs help people connect to whatever they need in life: **friends, mentors, wellbeing, self-esteem, networks, skills and employment**. Over 4200 wishes have been granted so far!

OUR UNIQUE SOCIAL FRANCHISE MODEL

Creativity Australia has heavily invested in the tools and systems to scale the *With One Voice* program in local communities across Australia using a social franchise model. Through the *With One Voice* Start Up project we provide up to \$10,000 in seed funding grant, \$2,500 in training and development, dedicated mentor phone support, templates, video tutorials and the *With One Voice* Member Management System to successfully launch, establish and create local ownership of the program.

Based on the successful outcomes of our many programs over many years using a traditional charity model, the *With One Voice* Social Franchise model was devised because we identified long-term risks with centralised fundraising and program delivery. More importantly, we identified the many benefits of empowering local communities to 'own' their own programs from the beginning, including building capacity for local fundraising.


Each new program is set up as an unincorporated association under licence from Creativity Australia and has a set of governing rules stipulating how the program operates. A key part of the model is the support program which provides communities with the combined experience gathered by Creativity Australia over twelve years, yet is delivered in a way that the local organising committee takes immediate ownership and learns from our collective experience. Following the initial 12-month mentoring program, the local communities continue to have access to Creativity Australia mentors on an as-needs basis.

THE POWER OF GIVING

Many participants reported giving to others, both through the Giving Circle and Wish List programs and also informally, but preferred to be seen as the "giver" rather than the "recipient" of help.

When people are empowered to ask for what they need in life and give back to others, a great sense of joy and equality is achieved.

THE WISH LIST

Participants are encouraged weekly to ask for what they need in life, and other members can make these wishes come true. For example: jobs & resume assistance, work experience & mentors, language tuition, music lessons, someone to walk with them to the train station - anything! 4200 wishes have been granted since 2013.

THE GIVING CIRCLE

<u>The Giving Circle</u> is a group specifically set up to thank and recognise all individuals that help to support disadvantaged participants through tax-deductible donations from \$20. By donating you are giving someone less fortunate the opportunity to be a part of the life-changing With One Voice program. You can support as many participants as you like, for as long as you like. For less than three coffees a week you can support one participant for an entire year.


"My life is full and happy with interesting work, family and friends. But too often a full life can become a frantic life. At choir, I can forget about lists and obligations. I also discovered that choir filled a need I didn't know I had: to be creative and to express myself. I was even inspired to start singing lessons at the age of 50!

OUR IMPACT

EVALUATION OVERVIEW

In partnership with Swinburne University of Technology's Centre for Social Impact, with funding support by Beyondblue and the Mitchell Institute for Health and Education Policy, Creativity Australia undertook an external evaluation of the With One Voice program. This study forms the baseline for a more in-depth independent analysis to evaluate longitudinal program impact.

The results show the *With One Voice* choirs provide valuable networks for diverse people, especially in times of need. Key evaluation results are displayed below.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT



After the unique and unprecedented challenges of 2020, we (optimistically) looked forward to a simpler and clearer environment in 2021.

This of course did not occur.

While the first months of 2021 saw many of us attempt to return to something resembling 'normal' living, the gathering restrictions continued to significantly affect 85% of our choirs and their ability to deliver a weekly choir rehearsal. Masks are not nice to sing in and many venues had directions on distancing that made delivering anything untenable.

Suffice to say, there was little in-person singing happening. Our program is built on connection and being together and this challenged us all. With the exceptions of Perth, Break O'Day, Mackay and Brisbane (for some time), our other 25 choirs had to negotiate being unable to provide a meaningful engagement for their members and communities.

We once again headed back to a primarily online environment. Our only real option.

Encouragingly, due to the exceptional work of all our people around the country we managed to accomplish some wonderful things. We're very proud of these achievements:

- 1. NONE of our choirs folded ALL remain viable and active community connectors
- 2. We kept ALL our music professionals employed and PAID in stark contrast to the majority of the Arts sector
- 3. Since March 2020 in response to the Covid pandemic we delivered more than 700 unique online sessions, featuring 32 professional artists, reaching 20,000+ people, with more than 192,000 unique engagements and more than 557,000 video minutes viewed
- 4. We created an amazing and uplifting online music piece We all Sing Together featuring more than 200 members from around Australia
- 5. We continued to provide a place for people to feel welcome, heard and supported during uncertain times
- 6. We continued to support the mental health of our entire community of stakeholders

The Online Livestream experience over the past 2 years has provided many unexpected joys. Each week our wonderful conductors re-arranged their living rooms to allow us in and to experience a little bit of connection and familiarity. I watched almost 650 of them and it was a significant part of my coping strategy throughout the extended lockdowns in Melbourne - I know this was a similar experience to hundreds of others around the country. It was a wonderful opportunity to see the talent and commitment of our music professionals, they were honest, open, vulnerable and funny. This in turn gave many of our viewers the comfort to share their challenges knowing that we were all feeling unsure and uncertain about what was happening in our communities. This is the power of music and this is the power of With One Voice.

While there were many, many contributors to these wonderful results, I would like to thank the Staff and volunteers who bravely took every sudden change and every new and different guideline or restriction in their stride and kept supporting, communicating and delivering throughout. Helena Jones, Catherine Copley, Andrea Guo, all our 30 Conductors around the Country and the hundreds of community volunteers deserve a huge thank-you for keeping a space available for our choirs to return to when the time comes.

Where uncertainty and adversity have been the shared experience, we will continue to provide our local programs with the skills and support to **deal with existing and emerging issues** to truly deliver a welcoming and inclusive place for all. Equipping our choirs with better inclusion strategies and supporting our people to provide informed and effective management of our choirs will see all those who attend thrive - especially those with mental illness, disability or under/unemployment.

Kym Dillon, our longest serving Conductor, sums up what getting our choirs back and established in our communities will mean:

"Over 11 years I have been told countless times from members that this is the best thing in their week, or the only thing in their week they look forward to. For some, the fun and inclusion of choir kept them alive during a very difficult period. For many who live alone, this is the only time they leave their house and experience that vital sense of community. This was even the case during lockdowns, where I was told on multiple occasions that the regular online sessions from WOV conductors was the thing that 'kept them going'. Community singing has a way of drawing people from all walks of life together, and the particular manner of the WOV approach greatly extends that sense of welcome and prioritises it, where no matter who you are you have a place in this singing family".

It's been a difficult and unpredictable road, but we're positive and keen to meet and overcome whatever 2022 brings, create a bright and positive future for our organisation and its people and continue to 'Change the world One Voice at a time'.

CONTINUING THROUGH THE PANDEMIC

A Conductor's reflection

A second year of the COVID-19 pandemic as Community Choir Leaders was, of course, full of many challenges. That doesn't mean to say there weren't many deep blessings along the way.

The big challenge: "How do we keep our choirs connected, inspired and singing through the various lockdowns and restrictions, in these times where opportunities for healthy, joyous human connection are needed more than ever?"

We can be super-proud of how each choir and WOV as a whole, found creative ways to achieve this.

Technology empowering WOV Conductors to outreach not only to our own local choir members, but way beyond our own backyards is something for which I know we are all entirely grateful.

Not only were we able to keep being employed in the job we love (no small feat), we were able to continue to use music to help ease isolation and loneliness, to bring joy and vital human connection when these were vitally important for communities experiencing crisis.

Although we were "all in this together", every region had its own situation and each choir its own story.

Some of our choirs were heavily affected by 2021's COVID-19 ever-evolving situation, particularly those in Melbourne and Sydney which endured lengthy (dare I say brutal, but life-saving) shutdowns and restrictions. Other choirs hardly even needed to don a mask and continued on pretty much as usual!

Our great silver lining was that we actually came together more as a national community than we had before the pandemic. We found ways of operating which brought our beautiful WOV choir communities around Australia together on a regular basis.

Conductors connected with others more too through regular Zoom Meetings, accompanied by drinks, nibblies and much cheer. What a blessing to not feel alone as a Leader!

We continued to deliver an impressive program of weekly singing gatherings on the WOV Live Facebook channel; sessions which were a lifeline for many, including for the Conductors presenting them.

Through WOV Live, we saw the development of an "inter-choir" online community of people from around Australia and even overseas, WOV members or not. I got quite used to saying "Good morning" to folks in the UK when it was night-time in Australia. I even learned to say "Goedemorgen" to our 'streamers in Holland, albeit poorly pronounced. I did get better at it as time went on, thanks to instruction from our lovely Dutch participants.

Borders being closed or open meant nothing when we came together to sing every night, wherever we were, We truly rose above, soaring on the wings of our shared love of song.

Zoom video parties showcasing both choristers and conductors were a highlight. These "Zooms" supplemented and complemented the Facebook Livestreams.

Some choirs did manage to sing together in person for a good part of 2021. I was grateful that in Brisbane we did. Sure, I lost lose count of how many times I rewrote our choir COVID-Safety policies and procedures. Who knew that being a musician would lead me to become an expert in devising health protocols for community choirs!? It was completely well worth it for us to be able to more safely sing together between those lockdowns. And how lucky are we that we live in a country where we can perform outdoors most of the year!

2021 also brought us nourishing opportunities for inter-choir collaboration. The WOV Australia original music-video project *We All Sing Together* was a platform for creative and artistic expression by the broader WOV Australia community. My accomplice Jay Turner and I were thrilled to be involved in literally bringing together many diverse voices in the audio track and then to see the video come together led by WOV Greater Dandenong's awesome leaders, Nicki Johnson and Craig Barrie.

What a fun and apt way to celebrate and demonstrate WOV's resilience, creative energy and optimism for the year ahead as we emerge from the shadow of the pandemic stronger than before.

Long may WOV continue to bring healing, joy and connection across the planet through the power of song.


2020/21 AND OUR ONLINE TRANSFORMATION

With social distancing and self isolation becoming our day to day reality during 2020/21, we at Creativity Australia wanted to ensure we were still delivering our inclusive *With One Voice* choir programs to our members and guests, even if we couldn't be together in person.

In light of the pandemic circumstances, we were forced to suspend in-person gatherings and come up with something to keep us all singing together during this time of hardship.

We enlisted the help of our amazing conductors, based all around Australia - to deliver LIVE online sessions most nights of the week. Each weeknight, we offered 30 minute LIVE broadcasts via facebook.com/WOVLive with a With One Voice Conductor. MICHAEL


On joining WOVB in April 2014, I was taken by the ethos of CA, but curious and a bit skeptical as to how this would play out.

Until now, this phenomena has been for me one of appreciation with the process of which I was beginning to take for granted. However, from witnessing the WOV's Got Talent and in particular the dance exhibited by Nakinna Atkins and Hayleigh Farlow, my attitude has now gone up a gear and bought it all back home. Those two young ladies epitomized that ethos, for themselves and those others in our choir.
