Cafe faces closure

COMMUNITY URGED TO RALLY BEHIND LEISURE CENTRE EATERY

A COMMUNITY advocate has urged the people of Brimbank to fight a proposal to close the Sunshine Leisure Centre's cafe.

Last week Brimbank Council's acting director of community wellbeing Kath Brackett confirmed the council had consulted with staff about a proposal "to permanently close the cafe".

'The Sunshine Leisure Centre cafe started operating in 2007 when the centre redeveloped," Brackett said.

"The sales made from the cafe are significantly lower than its running costs.

"If the decision to close the cafe is made, all affected staff would be advised of the decision and offered redundancy or redeployment options in line with council's EB (enterprise bargaining) agreement."

Ms Brackett said if the cafe was closed, the leisure centre's patrons would also be informed.

A source, who asked not to be named, told Leader that the cafe would potentially be replaced with "several vending machines".

The president of the Sunshine Residents and Ratepayers Association Darlene Reilly said many users of the leisure centre, such as parents of children learning to swim and senior citizens who took part in aqua aerobics classes, enjoyed meet-

ing at the cafe. "I think the pool should have some kind of cafe and I think many ratepayers would feel the same way," Ms Reilly said.

"I'd hate to see that it was closed down and if that's the case, the community should rally to save it."

Ms Reilly suggested that instead of shutting down the cafe, the council could tender out its operation to a private business, on the proviso that all existing employees could stay on.


