Creativity Australia receives the 2016 Melbourne Award for Contribution to Community by a Community Organisation & invites local communities to apply for seed funding to start their own *With One Voice* choir.

We now welcome all communities from across Australia to apply for seed funding to create a *With One Voice* community choir, to tackle loneliness, isolation and disadvantage in their community. We are also delighted to announce that Creativity Australia has won the 2016 Melbourne Award for Contribution to Community by a Community Organisation. - **8 in 10 Australians** think our society is becoming **lonelier**, while **6 in 10** say they **often feel lonely** (Lifeline 2016).
- **Lacking social connections** is as damaging to our health as smoking **15 cigarettes a day** and people experiencing social isolation have an average of **29% increased mortality** (Holt-Lunstad, 2010 & 2015).
- **Mental health** impacts **~27% of Australians**.
- **Real unemployment and underemployment** continues to increase (~26% over the past 11 years) and approximately **1.1 million Australian households** (nearly 3 million people) experience financial stress.
- Approximately **640,000 Australians** (~5%) experience **multiple and complex disadvantage** leading to increasing levels of social exclusion.

The *With One Voice* program

The *With One Voice* program is about **strengthening communities** and inspiring individuals to find their voice. A *With One Voice* inclusive community choir unites people aged 9 to 90, from all faiths and all walks of life: migrants, people with disabilities, job seekers, executives, seniors, students, refugees, asylum seekers and more. However, the *With One Voice* program is more than just singing in a local community choir. It is an opportunity to create **real connections between diverse people** in our community. It is about reaching out to those who are experiencing disadvantage and encouraging the socially advantaged in our community to engage with, learn from and help these people. Why we sing

Neuroscience proves singing makes people happier, healthier, smarter and more creative. Through uniting more and more communities in song, Creativity Australia aims to create positive outcomes for people experiencing mental illness, disability, disadvantage,

Our impact

Swinburne University research showed 98% of *With One Voice* choir participants experienced less stress, 91% improved social bonds, 66% felt less depressed, 70% gained new skills for work life and 70% gained increased understanding & appreciation of diversity.
