A St Helens community group has been awarded \$10,000 for the setup of a new choir.

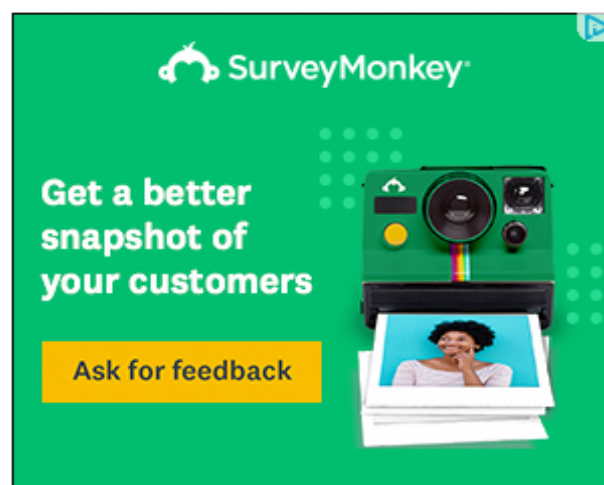
Tanya Greenwood of the Hub4Health applied for the grant to set up a With One Voice program in the region.
